The Eye and Ear has over 50 different outpatient clinics for the diagnosis, monitoring and treatment of vision and hearing loss and provides a 24 hour emergency eye and ear, nose, and throat service. The Eye and Ear provides care annually for around 250,000 patients, with over 200,000 outpatients, nearly 40,000 emergency patients and over 14,000 inpatients.

### Position Summary:

To provide high quality services to Ophthalmology patients, whilst obtaining advanced graduate training in the area of Vitreoretinal Surgery.

The clinical exposure is wide, ranging from acute management of retinal detachments and posterior segment trauma to elective procedures such as surgery for macular diseases and proliferative diabetic retinopathy. Surgery is under consultant supervision and at the conclusion of their Fellowship it is expected that the Fellow will be proficient in the entire range of vitreoretinal surgical techniques.

In the out-patient setting, the Fellows are able to discuss and plan patient management with the consultant staff and are responsible for the assessment, admission and management of acute problems. They will also spend time attending Ocular Oncology and Medical Retina Clinics, as well as liaising with the Ocular Immunology Clinic.

The Vitreoretinal Fellows participate in the Unit's ongoing research projects and are expected to submit posters or papers for presentation or publication.

### Key Responsibilities / Performance Outcomes:

1. Provide high quality standards of patient care. This includes assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation of care in collaboration with patients, carers and a multidisciplinary team.
2. Work within an ethically and legally sound framework. Ensure that the delivery of clinical services within the Department is in line with best evidence based practice and the National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards (NSQHSS).
3. Information Technology (IT) skills that are commensurate with the requirements of the role.
4. Attendance at Emergency Department, VRU and Medical Retina Clinics and Operating Theatre as rostered by Medical Services.
5. Initial assessment and acute management of patients referred to the Retinal Units from other hospital clinics.
6. Provision of on-call service as rostered for all patients of the Retinal Units and their consultant ophthalmologists.
7. Performance and reporting of B Scan ultrasound examinations.
8. Provision of laser treatment to hospital patients.
9. The effective teaching and supervision of junior medical staff in both the Outpatient/Emergency Department and Operating Theatre setting.
10. To participate in research under the direction of the Head of the Vitreoretinal Unit as mutually agreeable between the incumbent, Medical Services and the Heads of the Retinal Units.

Research hours not paid by the Hospital, except where alternative funding arrangements have been secured i.e. The Hospital Ethics & Research Committee or other research grants.

### Quality, Patient Safety And Risk Management

Ensure utilisation of systems designed to support quality, safety & risk management. This involves:

- Providing care that is patient and family-centred and delivered in partnership with the patient and their carer.
- Developing and maintaining your skills and competencies relevant to your clinical scope of practice.

- Participating in reporting and analysis of safety and quality data including risks or hazards.

- Participating in health service activities required for accreditation.
- Ensuring appropriate use of hospital resources.
- Demonstrate awareness of the financial requirements of the department and demonstrate an awareness of cost effective practice.
- Actively participate in the annual performance development cycle.
