Position Summary:

To provide high quality services to Ophthalmology patients, whilst obtaining advanced graduate training in the area of Cataract. The position also provides unpaid time for research activities to be undertaken.

Approximately 90% of the time will be spent on clinical responsibilities. This includes all aspects of cataract surgery, including preoperative assessment, surgical workup and planning, surgery, and post-operative management.

The Fellowship has strong clinical and research components and provides an opportunity for comprehensive training in the fields of Cataract. The Fellows are expected to actively undertake research and are expected to be involved in education and supervision of junior trainees.

The Cataract Fellow participates in the Emergency Medicine roster with hours ranging from 0745 to 2200 across a 7 day period.

Key Responsibilities / Performance Outcomes:

- 1. Provide high quality standards of patient care. This includes assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation of care in collaboration with patients, carers and a multidisciplinary team.
- 2. Work within an ethically and legally sound framework. Ensure that the delivery of clinical services within the Department is in line with best evidence based practice and the National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards (NSQHSS).
- 3. Information Technology (IT) skills that are commensurate with the requirements of the role.
- 4. To develop and refine skills needed to become an effective medical educator to train medical students, allied health staff, residents, registrars, and to provide professional development for colleagues.
- 5. To develop subspecialty expertise in planning and execution of cataract surgery.
- 6. To develop subspecialty expertise in the management of routine and complex cataract cases and associated conditions including performing advanced anterior segment procedures involving cataract, intraocular lens, and iris anomalies.
- 7. To develop expertise in and to participate in the design, implementation, and publication of clinical and or basic science research in cataract and anterior segment disease.
- 8. Involvement in a variety of quality improvement committees and activities.
- 9. To gain insight and develop a working knowledge of practice management and to prepare for practice in a tertiary level academic setting.
- 10. Management of hospital inpatients, including ward rounds.



- 11. Attendance at Emergency Department (admitting officer duties when rostered), Surgical Ophthalmology Service Clinics, Acute Ophthalmology Services Clinic and Operating Theatre as rostered by Medical Services.
- 12. There may be a requirement to work at one of the Eye and Ear satellite services within Greater Melbourne.
- 13. Provision of on-call service as rostered for patients of the Surgical Ophthalmology Service and its consultants.

Quality, Patient Safety And Risk Management

Ensure utilisation of systems designed to support quality, safety & risk management. This involves:

- Providing care that is patient and family-centred and delivered in partnership with the patient and their carer.
- Developing and maintaining your skills and competencies relevant to your clinical scope of practice.
- Having an understanding of working within your role and responsibilities outlined in the Eye and Ear Quality Clinical Governance Framework to deliver safe high quality and person-centred experience and care.
- Participating in reporting and analysis of safety and quality data including risks or hazards.
- Participating in improvement activities.
- Participating in the reporting and analysis of quality initiatives, adverse events and risk identification.
- Participating in appropriate professional development activities and other quality and safety training.
- Participating in health service activities required for accreditation.
- Ensuring appropriate use of hospital resources.
- Demonstrate awareness of the financial requirements of the department and demonstrate an awareness of cost effective practice.
- Actively participate in the annual performance development cycle.

Occupational Health And Safety

The Eye and Ear endeavours to provide a working environment for its employees that is safe and without risk to health. Employees are required to:

- Perform their work with due regard for their own safety and health and for the safety and health of other people who may be affected by their acts or omissions.
- Actively promote and demonstrate the organisational values of integrity, care, excellence and teamwork.

- Participate actively in return to work programs if injured, and supporting injured colleagues in their return to work.
- All clinical practitioners involved in medication management have an obligation to practice within legislation, the Poisons Control Plan, hospital policy and procedures.
- The requirement for Advance Life Support training will be determined for nursing and medical staff working in specific departments based on acuity.
