### Background Information

The Royal Victorian Eye and Ear Hospital is a world class specialist hospital in eye and ear care providing services across Victoria. As Australia's only specialist eye, ear, nose and throat hospital, the Eye and Ear has been providing care for the senses for over 160 years. The Eye and Ear has almost 90 different outpatient clinics for the diagnosis, monitoring and treatment of vision and hearing loss and provides a 24-hour emergency eye and ear, nose and throat service.

Every year the Eye and Ear cares for nearly 200,000 patients, with over 136,000 outpatients, over 42,000 emergency patients and over 14,000 inpatients. The hospital recently completed a major redevelopment to create a modern internal structure and to improve access for patients, visitors and staff.

The Hospital, primarily an ambulatory and elective surgery centre, is one of Victoria's largest Hospitals in terms of patient appointments. The Eye and Ear undertakes approximately 30% of Victoria's public general eye surgery, a large proportion of specialist eye surgery, extensive paediatric services and almost all of the Victoria's public cochlear implant surgery.

### The Position

12 months full-time. The role includes teaching and supervision of junior medical staff and thus require solid ENT experience. This role will contain a mixture of Emergency Department and Outpatient Clinics. There are no regular operating lists; theatre may only be granted in the absence of Accredited Registrars.

Some night, evening and weekend work will be required.

Research opportunities exist at the Hospital and rosters may allow non-rostered time for research projects.

Terms and conditions for all positions are in accordance with the Victorian Public Health Sector (AMA Victoria) - Doctors in Training (Single Interest Employer) Enterprise Agreement 2022-2026 and relevant successor agreements.

### Pre-requisites

- Current registration (or eligible for such) with the Medical Board of Australia.
- Completion of at least 3 years full-time prevocational training, including at least 12 months Otolaryngology training by the end of the 2023 clinical year
- significant experience in the diagnosis and treatment of common ENT conditions.

## Selection and Appointment

- Three referee reports will be requested for each short-listed applicant.
- Applicants not shortlisted will be notified by email.
- Selection is based on the assessment of the application, reference checks and interview.
- Interviews are required to be in person, but may be offered via MS teams in some cases.
