Position Summary:

The Theatre Technician (Casual) plays a vital role in supporting the safe and efficient operation of surgical procedures within the hospital's operating suite. Working closely with clinical staff, the technician ensures that surgical equipment and operating theatres are prepared, maintained, and functioning to the highest standards.

This role requires a strong understanding of sterile techniques, equipment handling, and procedural workflows in a clinical environment. Casual technicians may be rostered across a variety of shifts, including early mornings, evenings, weekends, and public holidays, depending on surgical demand.

Assists in the supervision, training/mentoring of other Technicians at that hospital and will, if required, undertake a clinical tutor role.

Key Responsibilities / Performance Outcomes:

- 1. Provide high quality standards of patient care. This includes assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation of care in collaboration with patients, carers and a multidisciplinary team.
- 2. Work within an ethically and legally sound framework. Ensure that the delivery of clinical services within the Department is in line with best evidence based practice and the National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards (NSQHSS).
- 3. Information Technology (IT) skills that are commensurate with the requirements of the role.
- 4. Cleaning and Maintenanace Duties
 - a) Clean theatres at the end of all sessions as required
 - b) Removing waste from theatres throughout the day
 - c) Develop and Support cleaning and maintenance schedule
 - d) Prepare operating theatres with required surgical equipment, and consumables.
 - e) Assist with the setup, calibration, and troubleshooting of specialised surgical equipment (e.g., endoscopic, microscopes or imaging systems).
 - f) Ensure equipment is cleaned, sterilised, and stored according to infection control protocols.
 - g) Support clinical teams during procedures by managing equipment and responding to technical needs.
 - h) Maintain accurate records of equipment usage, faults, and maintenance.
 - i) Adhere to hospital policies, safety standards, and infection control procedures.

5. Personal Development

- i) Attend in-services
- k) Maintain and update knowledge of hospital procedures
- I) Achieve completion of all My Learning mandatory competencies
- m) Attend compulsory fire, laser and radiation training annually

6. Other

- n) Assess workload in relation to patient care. Manage adequate skill mix to provide efficient Technicians presence to Perioperative areas. Feedback to Nurse Unit Manager at regular meetings
- o) Participate in trials and maintains positioning devices
- p) Be accountable for equipment function and cleanliness
- q) Follow guidelines for Technicians in relation to all biomedical equipment
- r) Provide guidelines for theatre setups of biomedical equipment for each surgical procedure. Audit 6 monthly by meeting with ANUMs to ensure information current



- s) Report Risks and Hazards as per OH& S and Infection Control protocols
- t) Report audit information to Theatre NUM

Quality, Patient Safety And Risk Management

Ensure utilisation of systems designed to support quality, safety & risk management. This involves:

- Providing care that is patient and family-centred and delivered in partnership with the patient and their carer.
- Developing and maintaining your skills and competencies relevant to your clinical scope of practice.
- Having an understanding of working within your role and responsibilities outlined in the Eye and Ear Quality Clinical Governance Framework (link) to deliver safe high quality and person-centred experience and care.
- Participating in reporting and analysis of safety and quality data including risks or hazards.
- Participating in improvement activities.
- Participating in the reporting and analysis of quality initiatives, adverse events and risk identification.
- Participating in appropriate professional development activities and other quality and safety training.
- Participating in health service activities required for accreditation.
- Ensuring appropriate use of hospital resources.
- Demonstrate awareness of the financial requirements of the department and demonstrate an awareness of cost effective practice.
- Actively participate in the annual performance development cycle.
- Is compliant with the Eye and Ear Data Accountability Framework (link).
