Position Summary:

The title of Grade 2 medical photographer reports to Manager, Diagnostic Eye Services (DES).

The role purpose of a Grade 2 medical photographer is to provide clinical expertise and clinical leadership to their peers, other staff, patients, colleagues, and students, across both Ambulatory Services and Surgical services at the hospital.

In line with the Hospital's strategic directions, as part of the Medical Photography team, to provide high quality photographic services and diagnostic imaging to support the assessment, diagnosis and management of patients and to facilitate research.

To assist the Senior Photographer (Grade 3 Medical Photographer) with the oversight of MedPIC to ensure the effectiveness and smooth functioning of the team.

Key Responsibilities / Performance Outcomes:

- Provide high quality standards of patient care. This includes assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation of care in collaboration with patients, carers and a multidisciplinary team.
- 2. Work within an ethically and legally sound framework. Ensure that the delivery of clinical services within the Department is in line with best evidence based practice and the National Safety and Quality Health Service Standards (NSQHSS).
- 3. Information Technology (IT) skills that are commensurate with the requirements of the role.

 - Contribute to reviews and audits of work practices.
 - Contribute to the capture and development of patient and clinical statistics for the Department.
 - To communicate effectively with patients and their family / carer
 - To communicate effectively with colleagues.
 - Demonstrate initiative to improve clinical service delivery

- Provide leadership for Diagnostic Eye Service colleagues, both clinical and managerial
